

Call for Student Travel Grant Applications

Presenting research at conferences outside Europe

Student research projects are central to many degree programs at the University of Oldenburg. These activities are bundled under the label [forschen@studium](#) and are centrally funded through the Research-Based Learning Grant Program that started in the Summer Semester 2021. Through the program, students can apply for travel grants when presenting their research at conferences in states outside Europe.

> Who is eligible for funding?

Students currently enrolled in any degree program at the University of Oldenburg (Bachelor, Master or State Examination Program) who have been invited to present their own research at conferences in states outside Europe may apply for travel grants. Students must be first authors.

> What is being funded?

The following types of costs can be reimbursed when attending conferences: travel expenses (train and/or flight tickets and hotel costs according to the Rules and Regulations of the Lower Saxony's Travel Law) and conference fees. The grant does not fund per diem allowance, reimbursement of meal expenses or fee for presenting.

The maximum grant is €1,200.

> How to apply?

Applications are ongoing, there is no deadline. Applicants will be informed of the funding decision in a timely manner.
