



Funding for Research-Based Learning Instructional Projects in Summer Semester 2024 and Winter Semester 2024/25

The Research-Based Learning Grant Program aims to assist instructors at the University of Oldenburg in implementing research-based learning methods in their courses. Research-based learning refers to the following practice: Students design, perform and reflect on the <u>research process and its fundamental phases</u> (e.g., finding a research question, collecting and analyzing data, presenting results) and do so apart from their final theses. For more information on this approach, please refer to <u>University guidelines on research-based learning</u> (currently available only in German). Funded projects will be published on the University's <u>Teaching Methods</u> blog.

Who is eligible for funding?

All instructors at the University of Oldenburg who wish to implement research-based learning methods as part of their courses (= level C in the <u>University guidelines on research-based learning</u>) may apply to this funding opportunity.

What is being funded?

Instructors can apply for funds totaling up to €3,000 per semester for hiring student assistants and/or for material resources in Summer Semester 2024 or in Winter Semester 2024/25.*

The decision will be made by a committee consisting of representatives from all schools and acting on behalf the Vice President for Instruction and International Affairs.

Notifications of funding will be sent by mid-February 2024.

Applications must include the following:

- The completed <u>application form (PDF)</u>.
- Short description of approaches and methods for implementing research-based learning related to the University guidelines on research-based learning and expected number of students (max. 4,500 characters including spaces). A maximum of one illustration may be attached as a separate file.
